Speaker: Julia Neuberger (NC 1969)

Julia Neuberger is one of the first two female rabbis in the UK (and the first to have her own synagogue). She entered the House of Lords as a life peer in 2004 as a Liberal Democrat, before moving to the Cross Benches in 2011 when she was made full-time senior rabbi to the West London Synagogue. She has undertaken a wide variety of philanthropic and voluntary sector roles, including Trustee of the British Council, and is a founding trustee of the Schwab Trust; the Trust exists to help support and

educate young refugees and asylum seekers. Baroness Neuberger chaired the Commission on the Future of Volunteering from 2006-2008, and was Prime Minister Gordon Brown's Champion for Volunteering from 2007-2009. She has written several books, including: *Not Dead Yet – a Manifesto for old age* in 2008, and *Is that all there is? reflections on life, mortality and leaving a legacy* in 2011.
